

To Be a Poll Worker in Ohio,

You must meet the following requirements:

- You must be at least 17 years of age and a registered voter.
- You must be registered to vote in the county you plan to work as a poll worker.
- You have not been convicted of a felony (unless the conviction has been reversed, expunged or pardoned).
- You will need to have transportation to and from the polls.
- You cannot be running as a candidate for the election in which you are working.
- You will need to attend a training session.
- You will need to work from about 5:30 am to 8:00 pm.
- Presiding Judges (1) for each precinct, must pickup supplies at the Board of Election and return election materials at the end of the closing of polls on Election Day.

Why are you needed?

- Without Presiding Judges and Judges the election cannot be held.
- Presiding Judge and Judges help to make sure that an election is fair and impartial according to election laws of the State of Ohio.
- The Board hires dedicated, community-minded individuals to staff and operate the Polling locations in Jackson County on Election Day.
